This year, I encourage each Club to ADD at least 10% to your membership (in most cases, that can bring our District membership back to 2020 – pre-pandemic levels). This will be a great year for Civitan!

Recently, I read an article ranking the most innovative organizations of 2021. It noted the most successful on the list had four things in common.

- 1. They create systems for continuous improvement of services;
- 2. They exploit their successes;
- 3. They *STOP* doing things that no longer provide value;
- 4. They create a different tomorrow by changing or replacing even their most successful projects!

I want to encourage each of you to take some time as you kick off 2022 to do an objective assessment of what your community NEEDS in light of the services you can offer. Focus on which of the four Impact Areas addresses the NEEDS you identify. ASK if your programs are directed to meet current NEEDS. ASK if changes to current programs could improve your ability to address NEEDS. ASK if a new or different approach would have a greater IMPACT in addressing NEEDS. There is a wealth of experience among our Florida District Clubs. If you are working to address, or seek direction in addressing a need, it's likely another Club has some wisdom to offer. Also, formal Needs Assessment tools are available.

This quarter the FL District Civitan Clubs will be holding Area-wide meetings. One of my mentors told me, "You cannot teach what others know; teach what you know." The Area-wide meetings are your forum to *SHARE YOUR SUCCESSES* and to gain *WISDOM*. Please make your plans to participate with your fellow FL Civitans to learn from one another and seek ways to improve your impact in each community you serve. Relate how your Club's programs focus on addressing the four Impact Areas: Accessible & Inclusive Communities; Education & Employment; Health & Wellness; Family & Community Support. Exploit the experiential advice offered by your fellow FL Civitans, as well as the resources from Civitan International. The strength of our Civitan Organization is our common mission met with our diversity. We share the mission of addressing the NEEDS in our individual communities through programs as diverse as our members.


## Website ... Penny Bonawitz

## Growth & Retention/New Clubs ... Wynester Sherrer


Building new clubs, maintaining growth and retention of membership, is very important to the survival of Civitan International. New clubs equals more members, which equals revenues for Civitan In-

## Philanthropy Report ... Lori Clapp, Ambassador

Happy New Year everyone! May 2022 bring you joy, peace, good health and good fortune. I hope you will spread these to family, friends, your community and Civitan. As Minor Meyers, Jr. said "Go into the world and do well. But more importantly, go into the world and do good."

The Civitan International Research Center (CIRC) remains the Flagship Project for our organization. Through our donations via the Civitans at the Helm (CATH) program, we help CIRC attract top talent and fund the programs which have enabled them to emerge as a world leader in the research and treatment of Intellectual and Developmental Disabilities (I/DD) which impact the



lives of one in six people worldwide. As of this writing, the 2020-2021 CATH year-end report has not been finalized. Civitan is awaiting the final report from Chesapeake's Foundation to apply the matching funds to clubs. he report will be sent to the District Board and club presidents when received. I did receive the 2021-2022 1st Quarter report (Oct – Dec). I'm happy to report that 8 clubs have already achieved one of CATH levels!

Please consider giving generously to CIRC as individuals and clubs. In addition, your contributions to All-In-Summit (**Due February 1!**), Dance-A-Thon, Break Through Golf Benefit and Walk & Roll for Research also count toward Civitans at the Helm. Just remember to send your donations to Civitan International, rather than directly to CIRC, noting the donation is to be applied to CIRC via Civitans at the Helm and provide your club name for CATH credit. Do this as early as possible so your donation might be matched 1 for 1, by the Chesapeake District's foundation, which is applied at a "first donated, first matched" basis.

Now may be a good time for your club to consider honoring a deserving Civitan, Junior Civitan, Junior Advisor, or supporter with a Civitan or Junior Civitan Fellow. It can be especially meaningful to have the Junior Fellow presented at the Junior District Convention, this year scheduled for March 26. The July International Convention in San Antonio would be a great place to have the other Fellows presented. Junior Civitan Fellows should be filed soon if you want to have it presented at the Junior Convention. But you can even start the process now for the other Fellows, while you continue to build the funds for the honor to presented later.




### LEESBURG CIVITAN CLUB ... Kathy Hall

Charlene is a retired special needs school teacher in Orange County public schools. Sandy said he got involved with Civitan when his aunt and uncle struggled with "handicap" children in Gainesville. Sandy and Charlene are 88 years old. When asked how long he will continue with Civitan, he said he and his wife will probably go on "forever." God is good!
